- A variety of grassroots and national sources recognized the work of SVTC in 1993.
- SVTC's work in promoting reduced use of toxics in electronics and its work around SEMATECH was acknowledged in the 1994 edition of State of the World and in World Watch Paper #115 "Global Network: Computers in a Sustainable Society" by John Young.
- SVTC's electronics and military toxics work was included in "Environment and Development in the USA: A Grassroots Report for UNCED" by the Highlander Center.
- SVTC's work around SEMATECH in shaping high-tech research priorities has been reported in "What Works", a published by the Environmental Exchange.
