Dear Mr. Sanders:

Our organization, in conjunction with the undersigned representatives from other concerned organizations, have begun a community-based assessment process to study the impact of the semiconductor industry on our community. Based on the outcome of our assessment, we will develop positions on several current and proposed government policies that directly impact the semiconductor industry and the community at large.

In order to make an informed assessment, we are writing to you and other leading semiconductor manufacturers. We are seeking the following information regarding any measures, programs, or steps that Advanced Micro Devices has taken to:

** Establish a toxics use reduction and pollution prevention program, including but not limited to any goals and timetables for the elimination of ozone depleting compounds, carcinogens, reproductive toxins, neuro-toxins and toxic gases used in your production processes. Do you participate in EPA's 33/50 program? If so, what has been your experience?

** Develop new health and safety education programs that are sensitive to the diversity of the semiconductor workforce;

** Create a publicly available system for health monitoring and reporting;

** Implement programs to improve job satisfaction and upgrade job skills, including promotional and training programs for the lower skilled employees;

** Develop "Economic Impact Statements" for future semiconductor facility expansion or relocation;

** Develop local emergency planning and worst case disaster scenarios and related evacuation plans;

** Ensure that your sub-contractors and vendors also engage in socially and environmentally responsible practices;
